

Did You Know?....

- The Mustang first appeared as the Indianapolis 500 Pace Car in 1964
- The 302 cubic inch powerplant gained new muscle in 1969 when Ford engineers unveiled a newly designed canted valve “cleveland” cylinder head.
- The Shelby model was dropped from the production line in 1970, however these models were actually converted 1969 models.
- A Mustang driven by Bobby Allison won a NASCAR Grand National Race on August 6, 1971, at Winston – Salem, NC. The race was the first of six experimental races that pitted the smaller Mustang – size cars with the traditional NASCAR big block – powered sedans. Even though it was a full Winston Cup Race, Allison never received credit for the victory in the “official” NASCAR statistics.
- The Boss 351 was only built for the 1971 model year.
- Between 1965 – 1980 the Mustang VIN was an eleven digit number which broke down to model year, assembly plant, body code, engine code, and consecutive unit number.
- In 1973 Ford announced it would cease production of the Mustang Convertible.
